Bronze Arts Award: Level 1 Award in the Arts - Qualification number: 501/0081/6
40 guided learning hours + 20 independent learning hours = 60 hours total qualification time (TQT)

Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is open to young people aged 11 to 25.

To achieve a Bronze Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual arts log or portfolio of their experiences of:

- actively participating in any art form
- •at least one arts event and their review of that event
- researching the career and work of an artist or craftsperson
- passing on an arts skill

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## Taking part in the arts and sharing skills

Bronze Arts Award is all about artistic inspiration, participation and communication. It supports young people to get involved in the arts, both as audience members and as creators, and encourages them to take their first steps towards leadership by sharing their arts skills with others.

This Level 1 qualification develops art-form knowledge and creativity alongside reflective practice, problemsolving skills and confidence. Participants complete a portfolio as their Arts Award journey progresses explaining what they've seen, done and learned along the way. For a young person to achieve Bronze Arts Award, their portfolio must include evidence of:

- actively participating in any art form
- attending and reviewing at least one arts event
- researching the career and work of an artist or craftsperson
- passing on an arts skill to others.

Bronze Arts Award is designed for ages 11 upwards and is open to anyone aged 11 to 25. It typically takes 40 guided learning hours and 20 independent learning hours to complete (60 hours total qualification time). Read the full qualification specification here.
